USS Carl Vinson Redelivered to U.S. Navy

Northrop Grumman Shipbuilding redelivered the nuclear-powered aircraft carrier USS *Carl Vinson* (CVN 70) to the U. S. Navy on July 11. The redelivery follows the completion of a successful three-and-a-half-year evolution known as a refueling and complex overhaul (RCOH) and was completed within budget.

"The redelivery of the *Carl Vinson* is testimony to the tremendous teamwork between our crew, the Northrop Grumman workers, and the Supervisor of Shipbuilding," said Rear Adm. (Sel.) **Ted Carter**, who was the commanding officer of USS *Carl Vinson* during the last two-and-a-half years of the RCOH project. "Without that triad of effort, I would not be able to tell you of all the great work accomplished during the overhaul period, which resulted in our ship returning to sea as one of the most advanced ships in the world."

The RCOH is performed only once in a carrier's 50-year life and includes extensive modernization work to more than 2,300 compartments, hundreds of system upgrades, and more than 20 million man-hours of work, to include defueling and refueling the nuclear reactors.

"The success of this project reflects the approach and relationship that this team has had for the past three-and-a-half years: 'One Team, One Goal, One Mission,'" said **Jim Hughes**, vice president, Aircraft Carrier Overhaul and Carrier Fleet Support. "We collectively could not have been successful without the talent, dedication and teamwork of our shipbuilders, CVN 70 crew members, SupShip and NAVSEA personnel and our suppliers. We've come together to bring CVN 70 back to life for another 25 years of service, and we did it within budget despite many challenges encountered along the way. This great achievement demonstrates our commitment to work with the Navy to deliver the best products back to the fleet while making sure we meet our cost requirements

and improved financial predictability."

USS *Carl Vinson* is the third ship of the *Nimitz* class to undergo this major life-cycle milestone. The carrier arrived in Newport News on Nov. 11, 2005, and more than 3,500 Northrop Grumman employees worked on the project during peak periods.

Named for former U.S. Rep. Carl Vinson, the USS *Carl Vinson* (CVN 70) was built in Newport News and christened in 1980. The congressman attended the christening ceremony at age 96 and became the first living American to have a Navy ship named in his honor. The ship was commissioned by the Navy in 1982.

Shipbuilders Recognized For SP&T OFIs

Newport News' OFI (Opportunity For Improvement) Program hosted luncheons in June to recognize more than 70 shipbuilders from the Surface Preparation and Treatment (SP&T) Dept. (X33) who submitted ideas during a promotion entitled, "Why Hurry Up & Wait." The promotion ended with 72 submitted OFIs and 69 valid suggestions.

"This promotion has been the most successful across the yard," said **Matt Needy**, director, SP&T Value Stream (O33), who spoke at the June 19 luncheon. "The promotional theme of 'Why Hurry Up & Wait' was chosen to generate ideas that will help the SP&T Value Stream eliminate waiting time in our processes by removing things that get in the way of us doing our primary jobs. We also targeted ways to make more effective use of our time in instances where we do have to wait such as paint curing."

Tonia Smith, supervisor in the South Side Paint Shops Dept. (M33), turned in the most OFIs during the promotion, with the help of the seven shipbuilders on her team. "I encourage my team to always be thinking of ways to improve how they work," Smith said. "I encourage them to think of ways to perform their jobs safely everyday and still produce a quality product. ... The team and I submitted a total of

14 OFIs during this promotion. We had 100 percent participation. ... One of the improvements suggested was placing spray pots outside of the spray booth so that paint is ready to be used, helping to reduce the amount of change-over time between colors."

The TCILT meets once a month to assess existing quality/safety risks based on current measures and information; identify opportunities for improvement; prioritize the opportunities; identify ways of reducing, mitigating or eliminating the risk; and finally present those recommendations to the trade director for approval. Once approved, the actions are then assigned and managed through implementation and continuously assessed for effectiveness.

"Any process/procedural changes that may affect the Surface Prep and Treatment core processes are to be presented to the TCILT to ensure standardization of best practices and to reduce duplication of effort," Clary said. "Our goal is to ensure that the environment in which our teams work in and the processes they execute return them home safely, confident and satisfied that they've produce quality products for customer each and every day."
