USS Scranton SSN 756

The submarine USS *Scranton* (SSN 756) returned to Norfolk (Virginia) Naval Station in August after completing a six-month deployment as part of the aircraft carrier USS *Dwight D. Eisenhower* (CVN 69) strike group. The submarine traveled more than 30,000 miles while conducting operations in support of national security interests, the Global War on Terrorism and Maritime Security Operations.

USS *Scranton*, the 19th *Los Angeles*-class fast-attack submarine built at Newport News, was the first boat to be constructed in the Module Outfitting Facility (MOF). It was christened on April 15, 1989, and commissioned on Jan. 26, 1991.
